BUSINESS AFFAIRS

Met on February 16, 2023 and will meet on March 3, 2023 to discuss Tuition & Aid Proposal by the President Favara, an SGA & RA Proposal by Cathy Brown, and 2023-24 budget. Tuition & Aid Proposal was discussed at length and feedback given to President Favara. SGA & RA Proposal was discussed and feedback given to Cathy Brown to take back to Student Affairs Committee. The 2023-24 budget will be discussed in regards to the current overall deficit and suggestions made. Please let LeAnn Moore, Chair, know if you have any topics you need BAC to discuss.

BENEFITS COMMITTEE

Did not meet in February, but is still working through deciding on a recommendation for a third party administrator to oversee the College's retirement plan.

BUSINESS OFFICE

January 2023 financials will be completed and posted with March 8, 2023 College Council materials. Updated expense and restricted reports were distributed the week of February 20th. January 31, 2023 Accounts Payable (open invoices) ended at \$262,327. For cash flow purposes, as we finish up the last 4 months of the fiscal year, it is extremely important for people to be turning in invoices in a timely manner so payments can be budgeted for accordingly. January 31, 2023 Accounts Receivable (student accounts) ended at \$4,516,762. Of this balance, the total SAS (on-ground) remaining balances for FA-22 and SP-23 enrolled students was \$1,080,580 (made up of 187 students). Students were allowed to carry over up to \$3,000 into the SP-23 semester. Of this balance, the total SPE & SGS (on-line) remaining balance for FA-22 (B,C, & D term) and SP-23 (A term) enrolled students was \$245,519 (made up of 89 students). Students in online programs are not allowed to carry over any balance into their next term. January ended with a positive net income of \$709,268 (December operating revenue minus operating expenses).

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We are in the silent phase of the capital campaign. The different "buckets" are a) dining hall renovation, b) residence hall expansion, c) rehabilitative & mental health program expansion, d) outdoor fitness park, e) civic engagement curricular development, f) annual fund and scholarships. Handout material is being finalized. The first "asks" as part of the silent phase are being made.

DON ANDERSON GIFT

Don Anderson grew up in McPherson and on the campus of Central as his father, Dr. Russell Anderson, was the academic dean during his youth. Don attended Central and went on to be an engineer in the space industry. He also served on the Board of Trustees for a number of years. He created a Charitable Remainder Unitrust (CRUT) that includes rental property in the states of Washington and Arizona. David Ferrell has taken the lead to bring this gift to Central.

UNRESTRICTED GIFT

Just this week the College received an unexpected unrestricted gift from the estate of Wallace and Frances Tippery. We thank the Lord for his blessings.

BECKER FAMILY

We are expecting a small final distribution this spring from the Becker Family estate, unrestricted.

DELORES DICKERSON FITZGERALD

Delores' daughter, Melanie Darniele, has indicated that a final distribution will be coming later this spring. Again, we are so thankful for an alumnus who remembered Central in their estate planning. Some minor mineral rights are also included.

FY 2023 UNRESTRICTED GIVING

We are significantly running ahead through December on total unrestricted giving. January 2023 shows \$426,403 has been received with \$287,508 received as of the end of January 2022. Of course the two major unrestricted estate gifts is the reason for the significant increase. Without these two gifts, we would be running about \$274,403 in unrestricted somewhat on par with last year and within striking distance of where we would need to be to reach an unrestricted goal of \$506,000.

OVERALL GIVING

Overall giving in FY 2023 is running slightly behind last year same time by about \$18,000, namely January 2023, \$599,655 compared to January 2022, \$617,519.

APPEAL METRIC REPORT

This report measures our twice annual June and December direct mail appeals. The report also tracks our Business Drive appeals and, as of this report, our Giving Tuesday data. We have four full years of longitudinal data.
