I. Opening Prayer: Dr. Jacob Kaufman

Old Business

- 1. Review and approval of January GEC Meeting Minutes: Meeting minutes from 1/24/23 were approved with the revision noted below under the Accuplacer Policy Discussion.
- 2. Is the college where it needs to be with the General Education course offerings?
 - > Service Course Identification: Why are they offered? Purpose??
 - Suggested we fix degree names (Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Arts).

Dr. Jacob Kaufman made the following motion: "All CCCK bachelor level degrees will formally titled as either a Bachelor of Science or a Bachelor of Arts (ie. Not a Bachelor of Science in ????) regardless of the major emphasis." Professor Heath Whitehouse seconded this motion. A short discussion reemphasized the need to align all Bachelor degree level names in an effort to prepare for meeting the HLC standards with their upcoming visit. A vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

- Defining what is needed and required for a student getting a bachelor's of science or arts.
- → General education should be the same between all majors, but they aren't. Different general education requirements for differing programs.
 - Can cause difficulties for students if they switch majors because they may have to retake certain general education courses based upon degree/program requirements.
- Cross-coded statistics between business and science. Think about moving all statistics into just one general statistics course.
- > Activity course for one credit hour required as part of general education requirements.
 - Do we need to require this of students even though over 90% of students are involved in athletics?
- 3. Accuplacer Policy Discussion?
 - Basic Algebra/Survey of Contemporary Math?
 - > Discussion of accuplacer and Survey of Contemporary Math everlapped with question one.
 - Noted by Mike Craig that Survey of Contemporary Math is not doing what it was designed to do.
 - (Revision) The current Accuplacer policy is set to identify students for placement into Basic Algebra, Intermediate Algebra, or College Algebra. It was shared with the GEC that Elementary Education majors do not have to take College Algebra, but are enrolled in Survey of Contemporary Math. Which begs the question of: Is the current Accuplacer policy relevant for all students or are there outliers to be considered with an adjustment to the policy?

 - Prescriptivism vs. Opennism
 - On-ground more open and online absolutely prescripted
 - All on-ground: Bachelor of Arts and Science blend in open and prescripted
 - Looking at prerequisites because it causes issues—if no prerequisites it doesn't make sense because then all classes are the same—should need to take lower-level courses before upper-level courses
 - GEC can set requirements and set options to meet for general education course requirements for specific majors/degrees/programs—on-ground and online
 - Going in and looking and general education requirements—degree requirements and also fit and think about what courses belong in certain sects of the core-4.
 - Look into catalog and identify courses to clarify/clear up any confusion
 - o Action point: go ahead and look into that—the catalog and core-4 gen-ed requirements
 - > Cross-coded statistics between business and science. Think about moving all statistics into just one general statistics course.
 - Online there is a social science statistics—also offer statistics for healthcare managers—online is different than on-ground—does not fit/fit into requirements—some on-ground take online social science statistics—does it work for business majors to take this course?
 - If we turn it into a big, blank gen-ed course, who will own it? What department does it go to? Math? Currently is listed as a GS—general studies course, but should be under department

- Only reason to have a cross-coded is for accreditation, to show up for graduate school and show up on transcripts for graduate school
- Piece of data to look at—breakdown of the core-4 and look at what pieces fit where within the gen-eds and requirements for bachelor of science and arts—specific BA and BS gen-ed requirements.
- Meeting closed at 3:54 pm.
